

Pupils across the school took part in a survey for Autumn Anti-bullying Whole School Anti-bullying week. These responses contributed to Term survey shared definitions of bullying. Warhammer Selected pupils A group of pupils requested opportunities to engage with Warhammer (tabletop gaming/model painting). This led to a lunchtime club being set up and an unused room being made into the 'Warhammer Room'. Summer Pupil Council Whole The whole school engaged in activities including Term school/selected pupils campaigns and elections to select representatives from each class to take part in pupil council. They will meet regularly and undertake project work. The council supported recent teacher recruitment by devising questions and interviewing candidates. The council shared their views on plans for developing the outdoor learning area. Primary Class 3 The class took part in creative activities, sharing a Parliament performance with other schools. Pathway 2 pupils Focus on gardening and the importance of growing **Global Voices** plants. Pupils shared their experiences of growing plans though the allotment education project with other international schools. Ongoing Lunchtime clubs Whole We have ongoing lunchtime clubs – Mental Health school/selected pupils Support, 'Our Voice' and a girl's group which provide additional opportunities to capture pupil voice on and ad-hoc basis.
