Residentials




The Summer term saw 2 exciting residential visits take place.

Firstly, in May, 8 pupils went to Krakow in Poland. It was an opportunity to visit the Polish link school, take part in joint activities and share our learning. The trip had a humanities focus with visits to key historical sites such as Schindler's factory as well as other important and historical sites across the city. The trip also helped children to develop their communication skills, self-confidence and self-esteem throughout their time in Poland. This was a new experience for the pupils; of the students who attended, most had not been on a residential visit away from their parents / carers before. Nearly half had not been abroad or travelled on a plane previously and none had been to Poland before.

Later in the term there was also a trip to Blackwell Adventure, near Bromsgrove. 19 Pupils attended for 3 days. Pupils engaged in numerous adventurous activities, challenging them and taking outside of their comfort zone including rock climbing, zip wire, grass sleds and other team building activities.




Sports Day
